So, Remember Hand Washing is important to help keep you safe!








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Manning's Methodology Corner Fishbone Reference Tool

In recent newsletters I have been explaining how to use a 'Wagon Wheel' as a Root Cause Analysis tool. This month I want to introduce 'The Fishbone', which you may find useful to use in conjunction with your 'Wagon Wheel'.

The fishbone is really a reference tool that can be used in conjunction with a 'Wagon Wheel' (see last month's newsletter), particularly if you are finding it difficult to think of reasons a Care Delivery Problem (CDP) may have occurred.



If a 'brick wall' is hit during completion of a 'Wagon Wheel' the fish bone can be consulted, and hopefully it will provide some pointers towards where the problem may be, by listing the various categories of issues that may have been present in this instance. For example, the fishbone will lead you to consider whether the issue may be with the person, or a staffing issue, either individual or collective (staff allocation). Could the CDP be a result of a process issue, or the availability (or not) and use of the correct equipment?
