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A Look back over Prosper 2022

As 2022 comes to a close we thought this would be a great opportunity to look back at how you have come up with lots of innovative ways to have fun and continue to keep PROSPER up and running in your homes.

January 2022 we saw a number of homes using the pedometers supplied as part of the NHS Deconditioning Winer Games. **Eastham** told us they held a charity virtual walk to raise money for Homeless Veterans UK, whilst **The Grange** decided to do a virtual walk to their favourite place Southend on Sea. Once completed they visited Southend in their minibus for fish and chips.







We also congratulated **Brenalwood**, **Popular House** and **Helen Court** on being awarded medals as part of the NHS Deconditioning Winter Games initiative.

Also, in January, Marmora told us how residents sleep patterns had improved after being encouraged to select de-caffeinated drinks from afternoon onwards.

February 2022 we were very excited to announce the return of The Essex Care Sector Awards later in 2022 following a two-year

absence.

Mundy House became the first Essex Care Home to win a Gold medal in the Deconditioning Games.
Further medals were awarded to Humfrey Lodge, Eastham, The Grange, Sweyne Court, Clifton Lodge, Beech House, Tall Trees and Popular House.

place at all times.




cherry Wood Grange received recognition for their 'End of Life Care' by Farleigh Hospice, who formed a joint initiative with

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August 2022 Mundy House told us about their Walking Club, which developed organically from a staff member taking one resident for a walk around the home each day for a bit of exercise. At the time of writing five residents were partaking.

One being responsible for watering the plants in the garden and around the home. The other resident being in charge of choosing and purchasing snacks and drinks for the weekends.

Freda Gunton Lodge updated us with their progress to completing their Gemstone Challenge.




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We shared an update with the progress of the students at King Edward Grammar School in Chelmsford; **KEG's Young Engineers Club**, working on the project 'Can Low-Cost Technology assist Social Care'. Our Prosper Support Office Rod Manning has been providing advice and guidance on Quality Improvement Methodology, the practicalities of care home life and residents frailty. We were delighted to learn three of the teams received national recognition for their work.







November 2022 was our Champions Day special where we gave a summary of the four sessions that took place at each event. There were 75 Prosper champions attend the days from 26 care homes.

Winsford House shared two stories, one telling us about how they took one of their residents swimming, she has always been a keen swimmer. The other story was about the home manager who takes his dog into the home. Residents really enjoy making a fuss of the dog, and it seems to create a calm atmosphere in the home every time the dog visits.
