








Headlines:


- 108 people are actively seeking accommodation in Essex which is an increase of 6
- > 33% of active referrals do not yet have an option identified
- The majority of demand remains for non-complex services (73%) however this is decreased from 80% from the previous bulletin
- > 62% of adults are seeking shared accommodation and 38% want self-contained
- Demand is higher in younger age groups (67% under 35 years old)

Headlines

- Broken down by district we can see the highest demand in Colchester followed by Tendring and Chelmsford.
- The highest demand for complex adults is in Colchester
- It is worth noting that the second highest level of demand for complex needs is 'Countywide' meaning location is fluid and complex services could be developed anywhere.
- Areas where more complex adults are seeking accommodation have a corresponding demand for self-contained accommodation



Headlines


- > 39% of adults with complex needs have no option identified a 4% increase from the last bulletin
- > 32% of those with non-complex needs have no option identified which is a decrease of 3% from the last bulletin
- There is a higher proportion of complex adults (61%) that are seeking self-contained accommodation than for non-complex (29%). This demonstrates the need for self-contained services to be developed for adults with complex needs.


Adults with no option identified





- Colchester have the highest number of adults with no option identified, with the second highest number being people who could live anywhere in Essex.
- Proportionately Braintree, Brentwood, and Colchester have the biggest disparity between demand and those that have no option yet identified
- 81% of the complex adults seeking accommodation need selfcontained services with need primarily in Colchester and Countywide.





Developments

- Thisselt Rd, Canvey Island -4 s/c and 2 shared (8 bedspaces) -Non-complex. No wheelchair access. Letter of Support provided (2022/23)
