Our 10 Years Celebration Community of Practice took place at Colchester Community Stadium on 18th April, and it was lovely to see so many people we have met throughout our 10 year journey.

During the event we looked back over some of the large and small initiatives that have developed from the programme.



We welcomed five guest speakers, all of whom had been home managers during the initial two year PROSPER project. Whilst some are still engaging with PROSPER, it was good to learn that those that have left Essex, or moved on to other roles, are all continuing to promote the 'PROSPER ethos.



May

In the May issue of the Newsletter we reported on the Wellbeing Walk of Essex 2024, which had been planned to try and complete a distant equal to the Essex Coastline which is 350 miles.

We reported that between them, 18 care homes had travelled a distance of 388 miles visiting a diverse range of places including Duxford, Southend Sea front and local garden centres.

A number of homes in the Clacton area had all met at Princes Theatre for an afternoon of fun and games.

Hydration was the focus of our Intervention series which included idea's home have created to boost hydration around their home including creating Hydration stations and playing hydration games, which includes seeing traditional games being amended to include drinks and promote the importance of Hydration.





Edensor Nursing home also show cased how the newly Drink Choices forms that had been created by the Prosper team, had been working really well in their home. With a folder being completed on each of their floors, showing what drinks each of their residents preferred including choice of cup and strength of drink.
