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Understanding Dementia & Delirium and Dementia & Hearing Loss - Alzheimer Society

This full day training session, run by the National Alzheimer Society training team, will enable staff to find out about delirium and the symptoms associated with, it as well as understanding the difference between dementia and delirium. The course will explain how to support people experiencing delirium in primary and secondary care which care staff can apply to practice.

In the afternoon the session will explore Hearing loss which can be more common as people get older. For a person with dementia, this can cause extra problems. This course aims to provide information about dementia, hearing loss and deafness and to improve knowledge and understanding of how to support people and improve communication and quality of life.

- Understand different realities and how to recognise and meet their needs

Resident M had been residing at the home for two years with no known family or visitors, eventually the home managed to retrieve some of her personal belongings form her old flat, amongst them were some old photos and a birthday card from M's cousin with an Australian stamp on it.

Devina and Susan used the powers of social media and managed to locate M's cousin in Australia. The home then brought Australia to Hargrave house by facilitating a video call between M and her cousin. Both ladies were so pleased to finally have contact again. M's cousin had been trying for a few years to locate her and had no idea what had happened to her which proved unsuccessful. Shelley told us "My team have gone above and beyond to reconnect the family together and I am immensely proud of their efforts!"

Well done to Devina and Susan for reuniting the long-lost cousins.









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Cook What you Eat – Elizabeth House

Elizabeth House, residential home in Benfleet, contacted us to tell us about their latest initiative 'Cook What You Eat'. Which aimed to get residents involved in home cooking and preserving their cooking skills while living in a care home.

Home receptionist Danielle McGuinness explains "All the residents made a vote on what they wanted to cook, and the majority was bread and butter pudding as it is defiantly an old-time favourite. We believe it is incredibly beneficial to promote cognitive stimulation following steps and keeping the residents happily active. Sensory stimulation is also very important as smells and textures trigger memories and past experiences, especially for those that have limited verbal communication.

Danielle continued "It was wonderful to see everyone enjoying the session together and having

that social interaction opportunity. After the baking, we all had a taste of the bread-and-butter pudding which was very delicious.

This challenge brought happiness and smiles on their faces, and everyone was talking about how they used to cook for their families when they were younger".
